
Invocation


Psalmody Psalm 103:1-8

- P Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name!

- Bless the Lord, O my soul!




Confession

- P We enter into this Advent season fully understanding our unworthiness before our God who has shown us His mercy by sending His own Son to be our Savior from sin. Knowing that our God is a gracious God and that it is His desire to forgive our sins and restore us to a right relationship with Him, we come before Him to make our confession, asking God to grant us forgiveness for Jesus' sake.
- We stand before You, O God, asking to be received into Your presence not by any worthiness on our part, but solely through the merits of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We confess before You all our sins, what we have done and all we have left undone. Trusting in Your mercy, we ask for Your forgiveness that we might be acceptable in Your sight. Amen.

- P We have reason to sing and rejoice! Through Jesus Christ and His sacrifice for our sins we are forgiven. That you may be assured of the forgiveness of all your sins, it is my calling as your pastor, to announce God's grace to you. 1 Samuel 2:1-10 (Hannah's Prayer)

¹And Hannah prayed and said, "My heart exults in the LORD; my strength is exalted in the LORD. My mouth derides my enemies, because I rejoice in your salvation. ²"There is none holy like the LORD; there is none besides you; there is no rock like our God. ³Talk no more so very proudly, let not arrogance come from your mouth; for the LORD is a God of knowledge, and by him actions are weighed. ⁴The bows of the mighty are broken, but the feeble bind on strength. 5Those who were full have hired themselves out for bread, but those who were hungry have ceased to hunger. The barren has borne seven, but she who has many children is forlorn. ⁶The LORD kills and brings to life; he brings down to Sheol and raises up. ⁷The LORD makes poor and makes rich; he brings low and he exalts. 8He raises up the poor from the dust; he lifts the needy from the ash heap to make them sit with princes and inherit a seat of honor. For the pillars of the earth are the LORD's, and on them he has set the world. 9"He will guard the feet of his faithful ones, but the wicked shall be cut off in darkness, for not by might shall a man prevail. 10The adversaries of the LORD shall be broken to pieces; against them he will thunder in heaven. The LORD will judge the ends of the earth; he will give strength to his king and exalt the power of his anointed."



Luke 1:39-56 (The Magnificat)

³⁹In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, ⁴⁰and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, ⁴²and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."
