# The Congregation at Prayer

For the week of *The First Sunday after Trinity*

**Sunday, June 14 through Saturday, June 20**

**“Faith Trusts in Christ for Life Eternal”**

Genesis 15:1-6; 1 John 4:16-21; Luke 16:19-31

When the beggar Lazarus died, he was carried by the angels to Abraham’s Bosom, for he was truly Abraham’s seed. Like Abraham, Lazarus believed in the Lord, and the Lord **“counted it to him as righteousness”** (Genesis 15:6). The name Lazarus means “God is my help.” The unnamed rich man, on the other hand, did not love and trust in God. He evidently cared little for the beggar at his gate. And **“he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen”** (1 John 4:20). He who loved and trusted in possessions and prestige died and was in torments in Hades (Luke 16:19–31). Repentance and faith are worked only through Moses and the prophets—that is, the Word of God, for it points us to Christ. Only through His death and resurrection are we brought the comfort of life everlasting.
