The Congregation at Prayer

For the week of *The Epiphany of Our Lord*

Sunday, January 5 through Saturday, January 11

“The Lord God is Manifested in the Incarnate Son”

Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:1-12; Matthew 2:1-12

The Feast of the Epiphany centers in the visit of the Magi from the East. In that respect, it is the “Thirteenth Day” of Christmas; and yet, it also marks the beginning of a new liturgical season. While Christmas has focused on the Incarnation and Nativity of our Lord—that is, on God becoming and being born in the flesh—the season of Epiphany emphasizes the manifestation, or revelation, of God in that same flesh of Christ. The Lord Himself has entered our darkness and risen upon us with the brightness of His true light (Isaiah 60:1–2). He does so chiefly by His Word of the Gospel, which He causes to be preached within His Church on earth—not only to the Jews but also to Gentiles (Ephesians 3:8–10). As the Magi were guided by the promises of Holy Scripture to find and worship the Child with His mother in the house (Matthew 2:5–11), so does He call disciples from all nations by the preaching of His Word, to find and worship Him within His Church (Isaiah 60:3–6). With gold they confess His royalty; with incense, His deity; and with myrrh, His priestly sacrifice (Matthew 2:11).
